## Reporting Serious Adverse Event's

- \* If you become aware of hospitalisation/death of a participant within 28 days of them taking part in the trial please let the trial team know.
- \* If the hospitalisation or death is not Covid-19 related, an SAE form will need to be completed but the trial team will advise further at the time.
- \* Please respond as quickly as possible to requests for further information, the trial team can become aware of hospitalisations through daily diaries/follow up phone calls but we sometimes receive limited information.
- \* It is important we find out as much additional information as possible to ensure accurate safety reporting.

### Shortness of Breath

It can be difficult to determine whether a potential participant has shortness of breath. You may find this definition useful:

*Shortness of breath can make it hard to breathe deeply and you may feel winded or as if you can't get enough air into your lungs.*

Unlike many other conditions that can cause shortness of breath, symptoms can persist and quickly escalate in people with COVID-19.

### Online Systems Updated

Our online systems for registration and randomisation have now been updated to include Colchicine and the changes to the age criteria.

***Please continue to support and promote recruitment*** in any way you can - especially now the trial has widened to include those aged 18 and over.
