Subject: REC Substantial Amendment 8 for PRINCIPLE Trial in relation to COVID-19

Please find attached the Amendment submission package for the trial entitled: Platform Randomised trial of INterventions against COVID-19 In older people (PRINCIPLE). The amendments are described and justified below.

Certain documents have been updated or created for the trial.

Summary of key proposed changes to PRINCIPLE Trial: Amendment 8

- 1. Translated video script has been created for local and national promotion of the trial. The video will feature on the trial website and will also be translated into other languages with the aim of reaching BAME communities.
- 2. Addition of a non-NHS site as a recruitment site BrisDoc Healthcare Services Ltd
- **3.** Text Message invite has been simplified to update wording around the test result into the lay terminology, this has previously caused confusion for patients.
- **4.** Video infographic script has been created for local and national promotion of the trial. The infographic will provide a clear summary of the trial
- **5.** Patient recruitment poster specifically for use in pharmacies has been created, for promotion of the trial in pharmacy settings.
- 6. End of follow up letter has been updated to include a link to the NIHR Participant Research Experience Survey. The information collected could provide important learnings for other centralised studies in the future. It is stated that this is optional.

Introduction

COVID-19 can lead to significant medical problems, hospitalisation, and sometimes death. The risk of complications from COVID-19 is generally greater in people aged 50 years and older with existing health conditions and in those aged 65 years and older. So far, there are no treatments that have been proven in clinical trials to help people recover from COVID-19 while in the community.

We need to find treatments that help people recover quicker and reduce the need for them to go to hospital.

What the study involves

We are looking for people aged 50 years or over with symptoms including a cough OR temperature OR loss/change of smell/taste, starting within the past 14 days. OR you may have had a recent confirmed test for COVID-19 with any other symptoms.

Registering for the study can be completed online or over the phone and no face to face visits are required. You will be randomly assigned to receive usual care or medication. We will send everyone a participant pack containing a testing swab and medication if you are assigned to receive it, directly to their home. If you have any questions at all you can contact the trial free phone number or your GP.

Researchers at the University of Oxford are appealing for people with typical COVID-19 symptoms, aged 50-64 years with existing medical conditions, or 65 years and over with or without existing medical conditions, to take part in a COVID-19 treatment trial - PRINCIPLE.

Currently, there are no effective treatments available that have been shown through clinical trials to reduce disease burden in the community. PRINCIPLE is evaluating whether certain commonly used medicines, such as antibiotics, may prevent patients with COVID-19 from becoming more unwell and needing hospital care.

The research team are appealing for people experiencing symptoms that are likely to be caused by a COVID-19 infection, for fewer than 15 days, to join the trial. People may also be eligible to join if they have had a positive test for COVID infection which was taken less than 15 days ago, and are unwell with any symptoms.

There are no face to face visits involved and people can take part either online or over the phone. Anyone in the UK over 50 who is unwell with COVID symptoms may be able to take part and a participant pack will be couriered directly to patient's homes.
